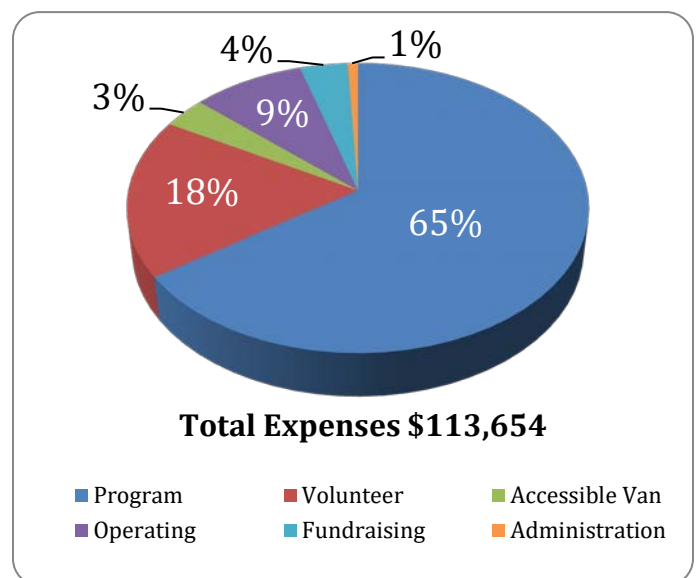
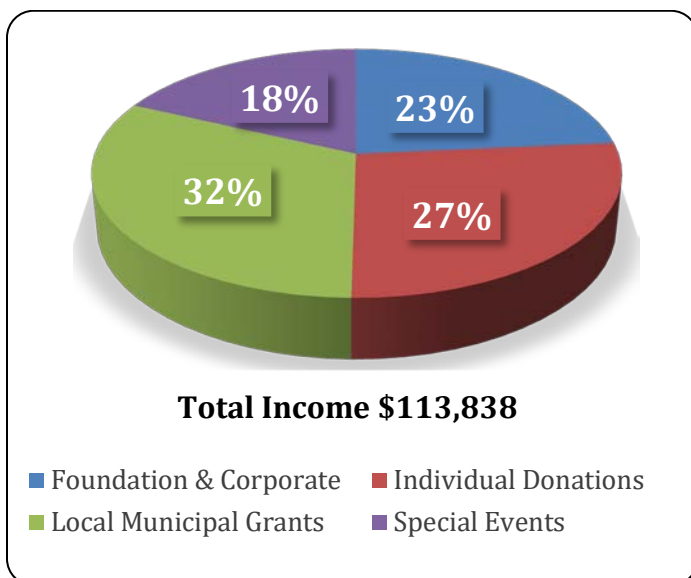
TASC’s mission is to help people maintain their health, independence & dignity by mobilizing volunteer drivers to provide rides to eligible residents of the NH Seacoast communities we serve.

Service is provided to eligible residents of Brentwood, Exeter, Greenland, Hampton, Hampton Falls, Kensington, North Hampton, Rye, Seabrook and Stratham, NH. Eligible residents are adults who are age 55 or better or have a disability or medical challenge that prevents them from driving. There is no charge for rides with TASC so that cost is not another obstacle for accessing needed transportation.

TASC by the numbers:

2019 Service Summary:

- 4334 completed rides provided by 50 TASC volunteer drivers:
 - 1614 rides for life-sustaining kidney dialysis treatments
 - 97 rides for cancer treatments
 - 240 rides for counseling and behavioral health
 - 445 rides for physical therapy and other physical rehabilitative services
 - 1698 rides for other medical appointments including dental and vision care.
 - 240 rides for social services, personal business, errands, civic engagement & social/recreational activities.
- This included:
 - 248 rides requiring TASC’s wheelchair accessible minivan.
 - More than 150 rides to Concord & Manchester, NH; Portland, ME; and Boston, MA and surrounding towns.
- TASC volunteer drivers drove more than 64,500 miles and donated more than 7,000 hours in service to their neighbors in need of a lift.



TASC's impact beyond the numbers

TASC's volunteer drivers provide a service that goes beyond a ride. They help people stay healthy, independent and engaged with their community.



A young man who doesn't drive due to a disability got to classes at a local community college giving him a chance to get ahead.

Over the course of several months, a woman recovering from a severe head injury visited a specialist more than 60 miles away for multiple appointments. Her health began to improve. She became more socially engaged and started rebuilding her life.

TASC offered assistance at a local food pantry making sure the rider and his groceries got home safely.



A woman who is blind needed help getting to a meeting of a committee on accessible voting rights that she chaired. The meeting was in Concord. A TASC volunteer driver helped her and a friend get there.

Recently, a woman was reflecting on a loved one who had been a long time TASC passenger. She told us how he hated going to dialysis but he loved his rides with his friends from TASC, not his drivers, his friends.
